



Sixth Form Dress Code

Sixth Form Dress the general code is 'OFFICE SMART'.

The School takes pride in the appearance of its students. Smartly dressed students create a good public image for the School and this is advantageous to both staff and students.

EVERY MONDAY & ALL Formal Occasions e.g. Speech Day and Open Days

Girls: Navy suit with a white shirt

Boys: Navy suit, white shirt and Sixth Form Tie

TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, FRIDAY

Boys & Girls:

- **A suit jacket/ blazer must be worn every day for all lessons and assembly**
- Jackets or blazers do not have to match skirts/trousers/dresses.
- Cardigans/jumpers may be worn under the suit jacket/blazer but should not exceed the length of the jacket/blazer.
- No 'hoodies' of any sort.
- No Jeans or denim fabric or any sort
- No strappy tops, nothing too revealing, no logos/pictures
- Coats can be worn over jacket/blazer for movement outside buildings.

Boys:

- A smart shirt and smart trousers.
- The wearing of a tie is optional.
- A short sleeved shirt or smart tailored shorts may be worn in the Summer term.

Girls:

- Smart trousers. No leggings
- A smart tailored Skirt of an appropriate length (no shorter than just above the knee, – no stretchy, Lycra or scuba material)
- A smart dress or of an appropriate length (no shorter than just above the knee)
- A smart top or blouse. No low cut revealing top or midriffs.

ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE

Boys & Girls:

Footwear

- Footwear must be suitable for school and a professional setting.
- Shoes or sandals of a sensible heel height and style (no backless footwear for Health and Safety reasons)
- Boots should be black, navy or brown but must be plain with minimal embellishments. No sheepskin or knitted boots may be worn.

Jewellery and make-up

- These should be modest and appropriate for the working day.
- No stretchers, retainers, large studs of any sort are permitted.
- Facial or body piercings (other than for one pair of pierced earrings) are not allowed.

Hair

- Hair jewellery should not be worn and hair should be a natural colour.
- Extreme hair styles (e.g. shaved patterns) are not permitted. Students will be expected to rectify any inappropriate hair styles/colour.
- If in doubt, students should consult with the Head and Assistant Head of Upper School before having their hair cut/coloured.

Accessories

- Outdoor scarves must not be worn in school.
- Indoor scarves can be worn as an addition to the uniform outlined above

PE Kit - for Enrichment/ sporting activities

- Trainers, socks, suitable sports/fitness T-shirt/vest., suitable sport/fitness bottoms/shorts, suitable hoody/fitness jumper/top.

When representing the School in a Sporting Fixture students are expected to wear team kit.

If you are in any doubt about whether something you are thinking of wearing to school is appropriate, please bring it unworn to the Head of Upper School for checking. The final decision about suitability is entirely at the discretion of the Head of Upper School and the Headmaster.
